We hope to eventually receive enough funding to create multiple locations in communities that need us most. We are dedicated to our mission, and we will relentlessly strive towards an artistic future that is more inclusive and diverse.

This organization prioritizes the showcasing of the artwork of POC in the United States. We are driven to make the general public aware of the fact that the culture of POC is rich, and we also hope to shine a light upon their artwork that would otherwise be silenced. We are providing a platform to those who need it most.

This program will occur in our warehouse, which will be transformed from our working space to a performance space. This project will be a massive cultural collaboration that is unlike any other. Every aspect of this project will be handled by our artists, and our staff will only provide guidance when necessary. We focus on prioritizing collaboration and culture, and this will provide our artists with a unique and fulfilling experience.

Our impact on the culture of our community will be undeniable and enriching. This program will provide the community with a cultural experience unlike any other. This program inherently places an emphasis on the culture and artwork of BIPOC, but also molds them together and paints a picture of shared struggle, rich culture, and passion for art. We believe that this program will have a massive positive impact on our community and those surrounding it.

This project, as the final event in our season, will be worked on throughout the entire course of the season. Our visual artists, creative writers, and performers will be working on their respective art forms throughout the season, and will choose which pieces to include in this final creation. Each artist will work hand in hand to create a performance that best

tells the story of their own individual artwork.

This project will be publicized by holding several galleries and readings that give the public a taste of what is to come, and we will also be in contact with local schools and organizations that are willing to contribute and help spread word of our projects. We hope to gain funding throughout our season by receiving donations from local organizations/donors, selling artwork, and ticket sales for both galleries and readings.
