What term to use?

- 1970 Hispanic
- ☐ 1990 Latino
- Latinx Gender neutral term
 - ☐ 76% Latin adults had not heard the term
 - 3% use it to describe their own identity (Funk & Lopez,

2022)

Transforming the Demographics

- The largest minority group in the U.S.A. right now
- ☐ The Hispanic population increased 60% between 1990 2000

(Mental Health America [MHA], 2022)

- ☐ In 2020, 19% of the total population
- □ About 50% of the population live in **California, New Mexico**, Texas, and Florida (Funk & Lopez, 2022)

☐ It is estimated to be 28% to 30% of the total U.S. population by 2060 (MHA, 2022)

☐ Families 3 − 5 Members

2016 - 16 % had achieved a bachelor's degree or greater.


(Non-Hispanic White 37.3% - Non-Hispanic Black 23.3%)


Multiracial Population

■Mexican ■Central American ■Puerto Rican ■South American ■Other Hispanic/Latinx ■Cuban



What is all this data for?

- ☐ The need for research
- Need of services for an underserved and fast-growing population. (Bermudez & Maat, 2006; Linesch et al., 2014)
- ☐ Art therapists are "natural agents of change" (Junge et al., 2009, p. 107)
- Therapists should pursue professional acceptance towards a culturally aware and ethical practice.



Acculturation

Acculturation: Process of adaptation embracing a new culture

(Linesch et al., 2014)

Acculturation Gap: Families adapting at different speeds

(Lee, 2015)

- Two stages: Functioning & Work adaptation
- Art therapy can help them integrate these two parts

Acculturation Challenges

- Legal Documentation
- Language
- Conflicting values

Multicultural Competent Art Therapists

- Art therapists required to provide multicultural services.
- Diverse in gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, age, or socioeconomic status

Art Therapy as a Tool of Social Transformation

Social action: Transformation that happens in a community

(Golub, 2005)

 Art therapy has also served as a tool of social transformation in different countries

(Kapitan et al., 2011)

- ☐ Junge et al. (2009) invite art therapists to go a step further
 - Target community and society

Hispanic/Latinx's Cultural Paradigms

- Paradigms are defined as a pattern of something
- Art therapists need to look at the history of subjugation and inequality to understand Hispanic/Latinx cultural paradigms
- Themes:
 - 1. Reducing subjugation and inequality
 - 2. Strengthen cultural values
 - 3. Cultural adapted therapy

(Consoli et al., 2022)



Accessibility of Mental Health Services for Hispanic/Latinx

- Lack of proper communication with the health provider
- 80 % of Hispanics/Latinx are uninsured
- Main Barriers: Disinformation, Language, Stigma, culturally customized services not available, lack of multicultural specialists, and unavailability of bilingual professionals
- Hispanics/Latinx would self-monitor their mental illnesses or find advice from a peer

Benefits of Art Therapy for the Hispanic/Latinx Community

- Art therapy helps with the acculturation process
- ☐ Helps express worries, anger, see things differently

(Linesch et al., 2014)

- Extremely popular in working with diverse populations
- Breaks language barriers
- Art therapy treatments cannot be universal

(Bermudez & Maat, 2006)

Successful tools: Visual Imagery & storytelling

(Lee, 2015; Linesch et al., 2014)



Artist Statement

"Art permits us to express our deepest feelings, emotions, and social concerns without saying a word. My work depicts the experiences of the Hispanic and Latinx communities through their migration to the United States. This project explores the different challenges this population goes through including struggling with acculturation, identity, grief, adaptation, paradigms, language barriers, and social inequalities. The purpose of my work is to create cultural awareness and social responsibility.

While my medium, a mixture of oil paint and clay, seems challenging, this combination mirrors the challenges faced in the migration process. The painting lets the viewer see the duality that the Hispanic/Latinx individual experiences when coming to the United States. On one side is their natural origin, values, and customs; and on the other side the new environment they are encountering. This duality is something that is sometimes difficult and other times very fulfilling". (Angela Lopez, 2022)
