Assignment 6 – Create a Residential Floor Plan

- 2. Students are expected to maintain a specified range concerning square footage stipulated by the instructor.
- 3. Students are to refer to the Project Program for information on spatial requirements.

Be sure to include all the following information in your drawings:

- 1. ____Draw with a minimum of (3) line weights showing space, objects, and texture.
- 2. ____Create a floor plan in 1/4" Scale and indicate the Scale on the plan using a graphic scale application.
- 3. ____Show all doors, walls, and windows.
- 4. ____Properly scale the staircase and indicate up and down arrows.
- 5. ____ Properly indicate ceiling detailing in dashed or hidden lines and Grayscale (color 8 or 9).
- 6. ____Indicate all flooring. The line is to be lightweight, Hidden, and in Grayscale (Color 8 or 9). Note should be a different grayscale than the ceiling, so there is a distinction between the 2-line weights.
- 7. ____Note any floor changes or ramps where applicable.
- 8. ____Show all components such as fireplaces, all built-in furniture, appliances, and plumbing fixtures.
- 9. ____show any specialty items associated with Universal Design, kitchen and bath accessories items, specialty closets, and all closet accessories.
- 10. _____Finally, make sure that all drawings are clear and legible when reproduced or printed
