An art craft that involves rolling a. J folding paper into shapes to create an image.




•What is texture?



Procedures

• Students will be shown a PowerPoint presentation on the introduction of quilling. Student will see examples of quilling and three brief quilling videos. After the presentation the students will begin looking for an image they would like to recreate in the style of quilling. Once the chosen image has been approved by the teacher, they will draw circles within the outline of their chosen image to establish an understanding of shapes inside of shapes. After the students have completed the rough draft, they will move on to work on Bristol board. The students will redraw their image on the Bristol board then begin the quilling process. The student swill chooses the construction paper they would like and receive a small amount of liquid glue. The students will cut their construction paper into strips then roll each strip and glue the strip within their draw outline.

• Once the students have completed their quilling project, they will place them on the drying rack to dry. If students finish early, they will be instructed to read or free sketch.
